Introduction

The Prospector union catalog has entered its eighteenth year of operation and continues as a key service for supporting over forty libraries in the Rocky Mountain region in the sharing of print, audio, media and electronic resources. In addition to its role as a system for the patron initiated borrowing of physical items, the system also acts as a portal to millions of electronic resources including e-books, ejournals, government reports, and other materials. For academic libraries Prospector is the backbone for the Alliance Shared Print Trust which allows libraries to weed and shape their collections based on the holdings and commitments made by other libraries.

The Prospector system operates on software developed by Innovative Interfaces Inc. called *Innovative Resource Sharing* (formerly named INN-Reach). As the premier resource sharing system in the region, Prospector is now home to almost 14 million unique titles representing over 34 million items. Approximately one third of the unique content in Prospector is electronic resources (e.g. e-books, ejournals, audio). In most cases users must have a library card to access the e-resources from their local library although some publishers do allow resource sharing for e-content (e.g. Springer and Elsevier ebooks). The Prospector system fulfilled almost 490,000 requests for books, ebooks, DVDs and CDs during the last twelve months.

Prospector Upgrades

This past year, Prospector was upgraded to INN-Reach 3.0 sp1. This update addressed several bug fixes, but most importantly it fixed a long standing problem with Denver Public Library's bibliographic records not contributing to Prospector. Thanks to this fix, the records that DPL has profiled to contribute are all now in Prospector and available for request.

Prospector was also upgraded to the latest version of Encore which provides more customization. Search terms can be highlighted with a selected font color. There is an option to choose icons for format types. It's also now possible to check multiple facets which helps to further narrow a search. Permalinks have also been added to Encore making it easy to bookmark a particular bibliographic record. This latest version of Encore also offers customizable headers to

prominently display news right within the Encore catalog. Due to security vulnerabilities and maintenance issues we have moved the Prospector News page from WordPress to Drupal.

This year the Alliance plans to purchase the WebPac Refresher service which will change the Classic WebPac, particularly the request form to better match the color and layout of Encore. This will bring WebPac Classic up to the latest implementation standards, improve usability and provide a more seamless flow between the two catalogs.

Library Content Comparison System Update

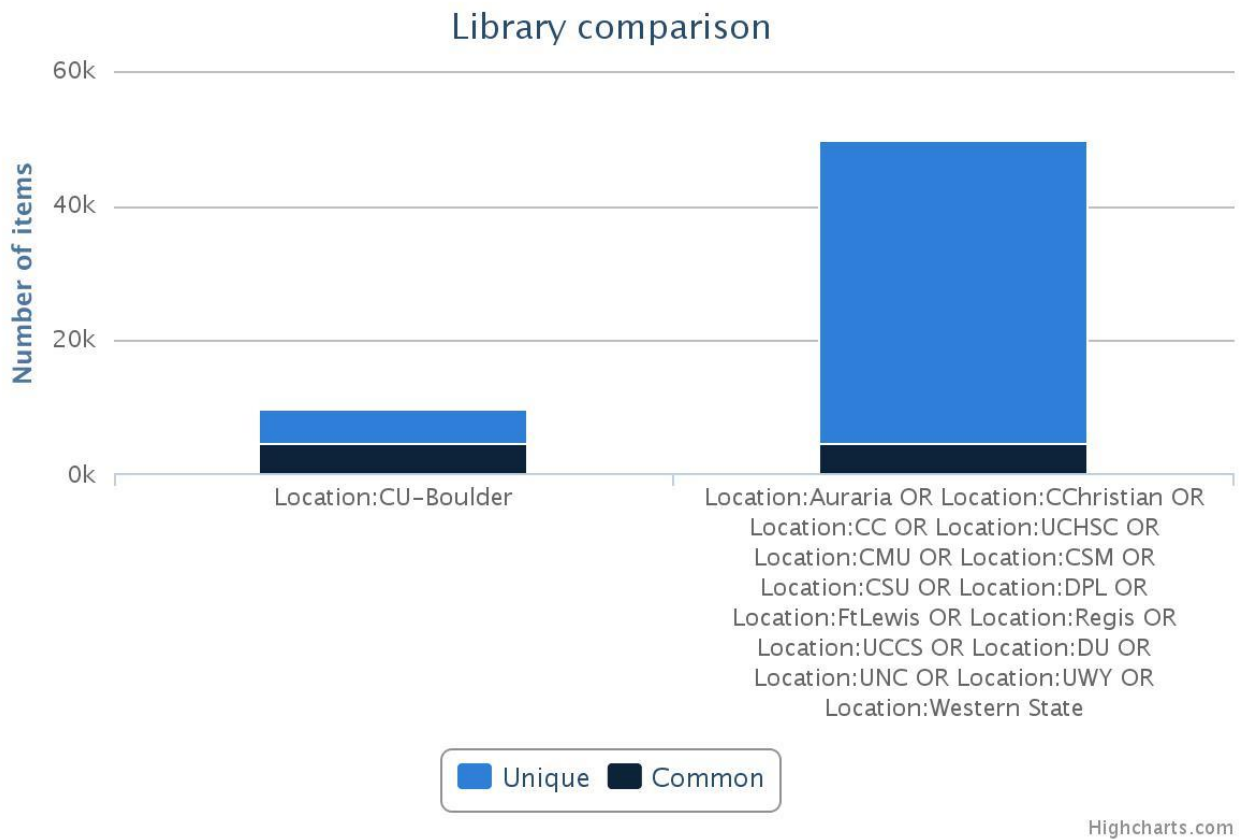
The Alliance has continued progress on the Gold Rush Library Catalog Comparison System, a tool that allows libraries to compare their library catalog to other library catalogs in the system. The impetus for this development is part of the *Alliance Shared Print Trust* among members of the Colorado Alliance of Research Libraries in which some libraries have made commitments to each other regarding the long term retention of print resources. These commitments will allow other libraries in the region to either weed materials or put lesser used printed materials in storage.

Over the course of the last year the software has added some new features.

- OCLC number searching
- Support for item level comparison
- Pop up description for 583 action note codes
- Ability to suppress unwanted action note codes
- Option to include match key in exports
- Better search performance with title and author indexes.
- Software optimization for improved record indexing speeds
- Continuous improvement of the match key for better grouping of individual MARC records

Any library in the Prospector system may load records into the system at no additional cost to their Prospector membership. Libraries that aren't members of the Alliance or Prospector may also participate but will pay an annual fee to have their records loaded. About 20 libraries in other states have loaded records into this software to assist in their regional analysis. Please contact the Alliance if your library would like to contribute records to the system. Catalog records need to be loaded as a direct extraction from your integrated library system (rather than taken from Prospector).

An analysis takes only seconds to run and data may be graphically viewed and records may be exported as MARC21, MARC XML or in a delimited format (for loading into Excel). Uses include weeding, collection overlap analysis, space estimates for building/remodeling programs, etc.

Publish Your Library Catalog to the Web - Bibframe/Linked Data

The most recent project underway at the Colorado Alliance of Research Libraries is an initiative to publish library catalogs to the Web. Commercial endeavors for this have been promoted by Zepheira using Bibframe and Linked Data. The Alliance will use BIBFRAME 2.0 which provides a foundation for the future of bibliographic description, both on the web, and in the broader networked world. The project is a collaboration between the Colorado Alliance of Research Libraries with Colorado College to create software and a platform to publish and host bibliographic entities that can be indexed by Google and other search engines (Bing, Yahoo, etc.) so that a local library's holdings are accessible to local users when searching Web search engines.

Since search engines are geographically sensitive, users of search engines should see holdings from nearby local libraries with links back to their local discovery layer or catalog. Records will be enhanced with geographic metadata (e.g. latitude/longitude) and other elements and interlinked using Rich Data Format (RDF) triples to improve retrieval with the key search engines.

The advantage of doing this initiative at the Alliance is that it will be free to members of the Colorado Alliance of Research Libraries and the service and hosting will be offered to libraries outside of the Alliance at a very low cost making it much less expensive than commercial counterparts.

Libraries that have loaded bibliographic records into the Gold Rush Library Content Comparison System will be able to use that same tool to publish their bibliographic records to the Web. A library may publish their entire set of records or may use the software to tailor a specialized record set for publishing using virtually any characteristic of a MARC record including format, call number range, date range, etc. The software is ILS and discovery layer agnostic and can work if a library can extract a MARC21 record from virtually any brand of ILS including, but not limited to, Sierra (III), Millennium (III), Polaris (III), Alma (Ex Libris), Horizon (Sirsi/Dynix), Symphony (Sirsi/Dynix), etc. Users on the Web can be redirected back to their local catalog or discovery layer including Summon (ProQuest), Primo (ProQuest), EDS (EBSCO), Pika (Marmot), Encore (III), etc.

New Libraries and System Migrations

It has been a busy time for system migrations and additions to Prospector. DU, CSU Pueblo and Fort Collins switched local systems to ExLibris ALMA and are now fully reintegrated into Prospector through the DCB (direct consortial borrowing), which is a simplified Millennium system, hosted at the CO Alliance. Colorado School of Mines and CU Health Sciences Library, also ALMA libraries, plan to rejoin Prospector within the next year. The DCB, which connects disparate local systems to INN-Reach is where staff process circulation transactions that are then updated to Prospector. One of the strengths of the INN-Reach catalog is that even if libraries aren't using Innovative for their local system, can still fully participate in Prospector.

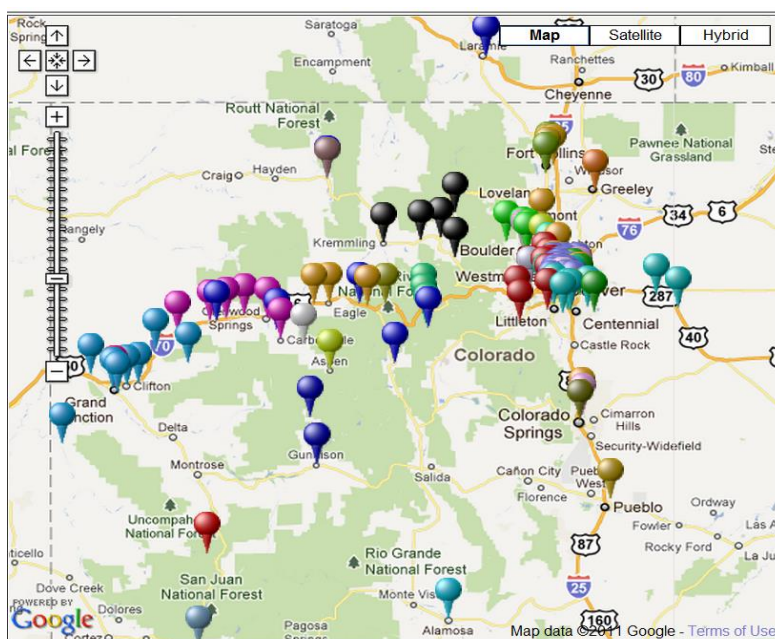
Four public libraries joined Prospector this year. Back in January, Lafayette Public Library joined Prospector by way of the Flatirons Consortium, a union catalog of 6 public libraries in the northern Front Range area. Anythink Public Library, which uses SirsiDynix for their local catalog, joined Prospector in April. Douglas Public Library, another SirsiDynix library came on board in July. High Plains Regional Library will be live in Prospector before the first of the year. The CO Alliance hosts non-Innovative libraries on a shared DCB server which resides at the Alliance. This is more economical for libraries and requires less maintenance on their part.

Denver Public Library is now up and running through a "direct to INN-Reach" API that Innovative released for Polaris about a year ago. This has improved the requesting experience for patrons, making it to easier track requests and DPL has a higher request fulfillment rate overall. Innovative has just released complete documentation of this API and is in talks with other ILS vendors about writing to the API. The API is a very critical development as it will eliminate the need for DCB and NCIP and should make communication between systems much better.

Who is participating in Prospector?

Prospector has 46 academic, public and special libraries with over 100 pick-up locations (branches). It is the most widely used union catalog in the state representing virtually all of the major academic libraries (excluding community colleges and for-profits) and many public libraries.

Prospector Map Showing Geographic Distribution of Libraries

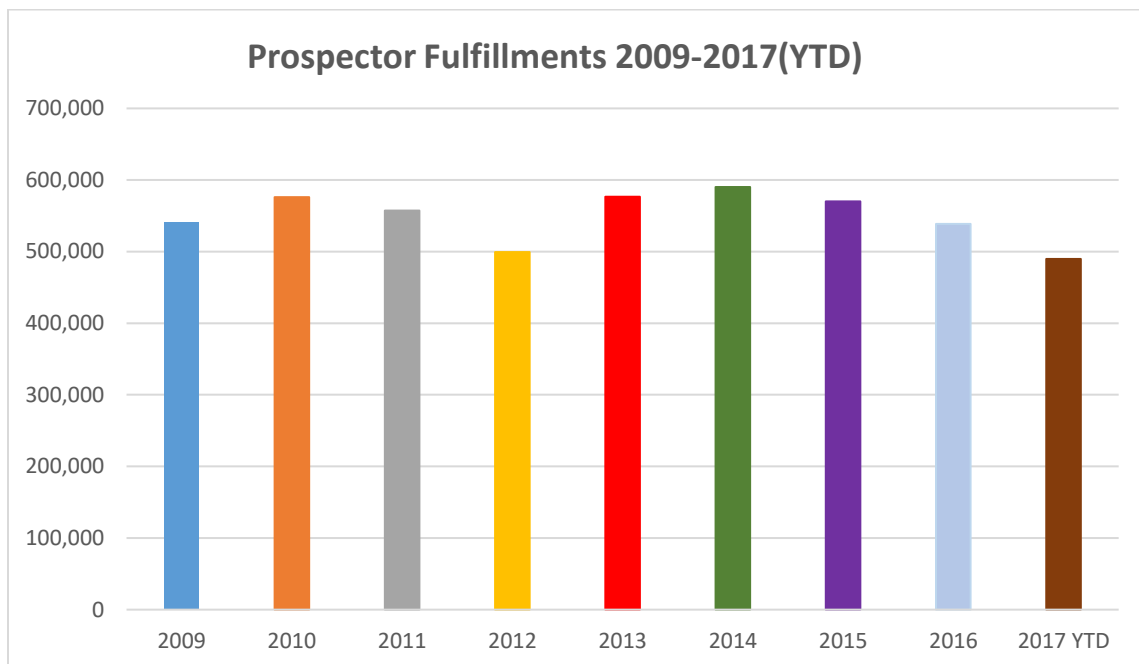

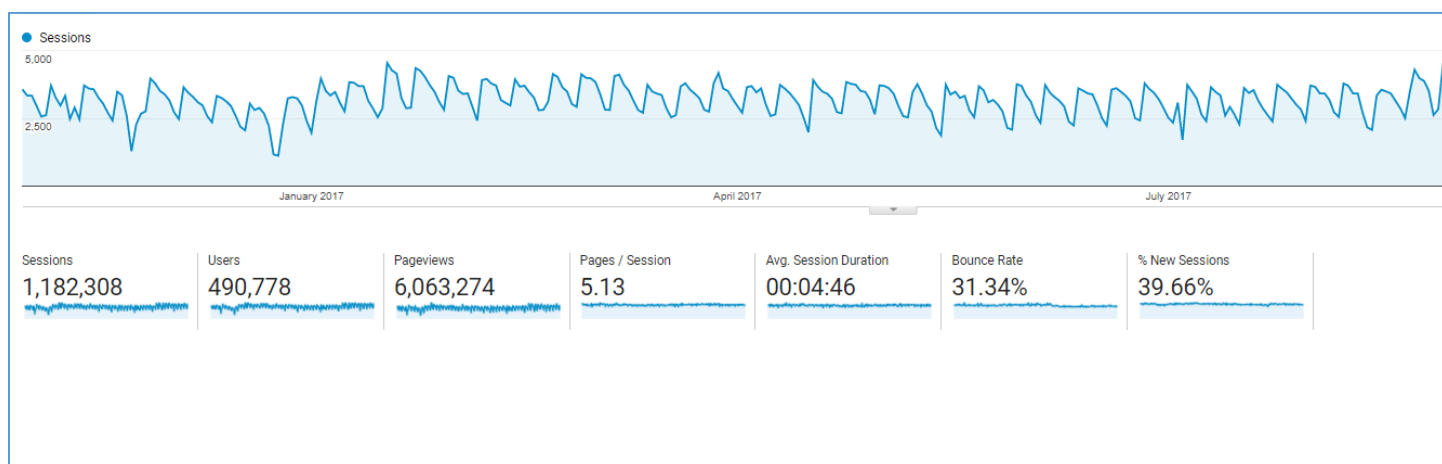

Google Analytics has been added to Prospector Encore, Prospector Classic and Prospector Mobile to look at overall system use. This table represents the combined use statistics for all three interfaces.

- 1,182,308 visits to Prospector (39% were unique visitors)
- 6,063,274 page views
- 5.13 page views per patron visit(Pages/Session)
- 4.46 minutes is the average time spent on the site
- 31% click into Prospector and immediately leave the site.

Peer to Peer connection with MOBIUS

The Peer-to-Peer project, which facilitates resource sharing through the Prospector and MOBIUS INN-Reach systems, has been in operation for just about three and a half years. Mobius has over 70 libraries mainly in Missouri, but also includes Tulsa Public Library in Oklahoma, Southwest Baptist Theological Seminary in Texas and West Des Moines Public Library in Iowa. Mobius has a line haul that runs from Kansas City to Des Moines and then from Des Moines to Davenport as part of the Iowa network of stops. They also have a direct line from Springfield, MO to Tulsa, OK and from there Tulsa handles materials going down to Ft. Worth, TX.

MOBIUS makes up less than 2% of the overall Prospector traffic and while that's not a large number, it still requires some amount of staff time. The largest lenders/borrowers in Prospector tend to do the most transactions with MOBIUS. It's anticipated that Denver Public Library will eventually participate in the Peer-to-Peer project after they connect directly to Prospector through an API. Peer-to-Peer software doesn't work with the DCB, so libraries connecting in this way aren't able to lend and borrow with MOBIUS.
